FLORAL REGULATIONS

1. Flowers placed on graves shall be in a suitable approved sub-surface container or basket
2. Floral stands, wreaths, baskets, and other floral tributes, which are part of the floral offering at the time of the interment, will be left for several days. All flowers will be removed when wilted.
3. The placing of vigil lights or candles, boxes, cans, shells, toys, metal designs, ornaments, signs, cards, ads, chairs, settees, vases, glass, wood or iron crosses, concrete urns, concrete planter boxes, concrete benches, picture or any article other than the approved family memorial upon property will not be permitted. **The Cemetery reserves the right to remove and dispose of these articles without notice to the property owner.**
4. Artificial flowers are permitted **November 1st thru March 1st** in permanent vases or when combined with cut flowers in baskets.
5. No granite chips, marble chips, gravel, brick, stone, cement or other kinds of artificial walk will be permitted on any lot or around family memorials or markers.
6. The Cemetery will have the right to fill graves and to plant grass on them. All graves must be filled, tamped and finished to level as the surrounding ground unless otherwise specified in these **Rules and Regulations**. All graves will be completely covered with sod. This regulation must be strictly enforced in order to preserve the beautiful, park-like appearance of the lawns and grounds as a whole and to assure the maintenance of the property.
7. The Cemetery will have the right to prune or remove and not replace already existing trees, shrubs, and other plantings that through growth encroach on lot owner's property, become unsightly, diseased or damaged by accident or weather.
8. The new planting of trees, shrubs, flowers or other emblems will be at the discretion of Cemetery Management. The Cemetery staff handles all plantings and maintenance.
9. Photographs, souvenirs, wreaths, flags or other emblems are prohibited in mausoleums and columbariums. If placed there, the cemetery reserves the right to remove them without notice to the owner.
10. Only dried, silk or cut fresh flowers will be allowed in the indoor areas of the Mausoleums and columbariums, and they must be placed in the niche or crypt vases. Potted plants are allowed only at the time of the committal and will be removed with the other committal flowers.
